Sue Miller to Create Public Art Project for Whitby Town Hall

The collaborative project encourages community participation by all ages

With just over a month to go until Mayor Don Mitchell's annual fundraiser, A Night Out on the Town, Station Gallery, together with the Volunteer Planning Committee has announced Sue Miller will create the Public Art Project for Whitby Town Hall.

Sue Miller is an award-winning local artist who submitted a creative, three-piece expression that evokes community-pride and collaboration. The colourful, detail-oriented paintings will each reflect a moment in time – past, present and future. The past and present will be finished pieces, while the future will welcome individual input and interpretation from the community. To do so, the piece that reads "Imagine our future" will be created as a line drawing on a laminated print.

"Sue's project adds a generous spirit to our community," said Olexander Wlasenko, Curator, Station Gallery. "Her complex painting style combines elements of light, colour and form to create an exciting vision of civic pride."

The Public Art Project will be first unveiled on March 25, 2017 at the event being held at Trafalgar Castle, before it is installed at Whitby Town Hall.

"The revitalization of downtown Whitby is a key priority for this Council," added Mayor Don Mitchell, Town of Whitby. "Taking a collaborative approach, Sue has captured downtown Whitby's rich history and opened up the possibilities of its future to the community."

The peer review committee was comprised of staff and board members from Station Gallery and the event's Volunteer Planning Committee.
